A copy of the signed DD-214 (member 4 copy), Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty, or other acceptable documentation will be required prior to employment. Current active duty military members are required to submit a statement of service printed on command letterhead and signed by the command. The statement of service must provide the branch of service, rate/rank, all dates of service, the expected date of discharge and anticipated character of service (Honorable, General, etc.). An applicant will be ineligible for consideration if the statement of service is not submitted with the application or if it shows an expected discharge or release date greater than 120 days from the date of application.
